**VISIT TO ROUEN, 15 – 19 June 2023** It's been four years since we were last in Rouen! So this is the long-awaited visit. We hope more members will take this opportunity to join us, as the travel cost could be reduced. The more the merrier. Every effort will be made to arrange accommodation with French hosts unless you prefer to stay in a hotel.

Sunday: Watch the Armada leaving Rouen from 9 am. Lunch at Relais de Montigny just outside Rouen with members of Rouen Norwich-Club.

Monday: depart Rouen for Norwich
